D. Guest Speakers:

 <u>Brett Weise</u> – Council passed a budget which includes funding to complete Ward Canyon Park. New City rules went into effect yesterday for dock-less scooters, yet citizens are reporting no change.
<u>Staffer</u> – Council President Gomez's office is pleased that the newly passed budget expands the Get it Done staff and increases the amount of Code Enforcement Officers. It also expands the amount of the City's Arborists on staff. On July 30th, there will be an Inclusionary Housing update. Coffee with Council President Gomez will be held on Jul 11th. <u>Zach Bunshaft</u> – The Federal Government wants to invest \$1B building a new Navy SEAL Training area along the Silver Strand of Coronado Island, but are concerned with continuous sewage spills from Tijuana and the associated health risks. The Defense Department has agreed to provide information from a Cold War-era military satellite to help spot new wildfires, while the acting Defense Secretary has given the California National Guard blanket approval through year's end to use unmanned drones to map fires, count destroyed houses and spot survivors. Congresswoman Davis will be hosting a round-table discussion on the Affordable Care Act. Congresswoman Davis is in support of the Green New Deal.
