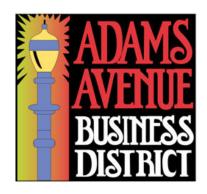

Adams Avenue Business Association/Business Improvement District

The AABA was formed in 1985 for the purpose of revitalizing and marketing the Adams Avenue business corridor. The Association is a registered California nonprofit corporation. The AABA is under contract with the City of San Diego to administer a BID program. The City collects an annual BID fee from each registered business license holder within the Adams Avenue BID boundaries. The BID runs from Vista St. in Kensington through Normal Heights to Arizona St. in University Heights. These BID funds are invested in marketing and promotional activities by the AABA. The AABA oversees a diverse work plan that includes special events, marketing & branding, avenue maintenance, weekly committee meetings, management of community assets, community planning, and advocacy. Partnering with local business operators, property owners, and government agencies, the AABA seeks to improve the economic and physical conditions of the business district. The Association is overseen by a 15-member Board of Directors selected from the membership.



Adams Avenue Maintenance Assessment District

AABA property-owner members are assessed an annual fee to fund physical improvements, maintenance and beautification activities. These are enhanced services beyond what the City normally provides. These MAD fees underwrite approximately \$50,000 of annual benefits. The MAD boundaries roughly correspond to the area's BID boundaries. The AABA is under contract with the City to administer the MAD services. MAD-funded activities include: sidewalk sweeping, power washing, banner programs, trash collection, graffiti control, tree maintenance and replacement. AABA uses a mix of contractors and employees to provide these MAD services. The AABA subsidizes the MAD with its own earned income and grant funds to further enhance Adams Avenue's physical environment.

AABA website, Social Media and Eblasts

The AABA website, adamsavenuebusiness.com, has details about our special events, Board of Director meetings, blog articles, business directory listings and more. Over 100,000 individuals visit the AABA's site annually. More than \$200,000 in sales associated with AABA special events are taken through the site in an average year. The AABA posts daily on Facebook and Instagram with a combined following of 17,000 individuals. The AABA has 13,500 email addresses in its database used to promote AABA special events and to communicate with our members. AABA Special Events

Adams Avenue Unplugged: Unplugged is a musical walkabout drawing music aficionados to the Avenue by programming inside restaurants, bars and coffee houses. The innovative festival format provides intimate performance settings while dispersing musical entertainment throughout the Adams Avenue business corridor. The 2022 event is scheduled for April 30th. Unplugged was cancelled in 2020 & 2021 due to the pandemic.

Taste of Adams Avenue: Foodies from throughout San Diego packed the sidewalks in Normal Heights. University Heights and Kensington for the 20th Annual Taste of Adams Avenue held Sunday, July 25th, 2021. Almost 50 restaurants, coffee houses, bakeries, breweries and pubs participated by serving samples to the 1,000 + attendees. The event has sold out for the past 10 years and is now one of San Diego's largest and most popular "Taste" events. Attendees walk a 2.5-mile event footprint but also have access to free trolley service. Taste of Adams Avenue us scheduled for Sunday June 26th.

Holiday on Adams Avenue

Adams Avenue Street Fair: The Street Fair is AABA's signature promotion and San Diego's largest free music festival. Both the 2020 and 2021 editions were cancelled due to the pandemic, but the AA-BA is planning the 2022 event for September 24th & 25th. The Street Fair draws 100,000 weekend visitors and generates record amounts of publicity, marketing and branding for the business district. Many area businesses experience record sales while the Street Fair generates a total of \$2.6M in direct spending. The Street Fair is also the AABA's largest fundraising activity, supporting the Association's year-round work. Event revenue from vendor booths, beer concessions, t-shirt sales, sponsorships, and grants gross over \$250,000 in an average year.

Adams Avenue Alive: The AABA produced a free weekly concert series in October of 2021 called Adams Avenue Alive. The event was initiated after the September 2021 Street Fair was cancelled. Three concerts a week were offered for all five weekends in October at three locations spread along Adams Avenue.

Adams Avenue Spirit Stroll: The Spirit Stroll was held on November 27th, 2021, and featured holiday-themed cocktails handcrafted by mixologists from Adams Avenue's bars and restaurants, served in retail storefront locations. The 500 paid attendees, sipped, shopped and strolled on Small Business Saturday, a nationally coordinated effort to direct holiday shoppers to small business. Spirit Stroll also offers sweets at some locations in addition to the spirits served. The 2022 Spirit Stroll will be held on November 26th. The AA-BA would like to thank San Diego's Cutwater Spirits for sponsoring the event!

Holiday on Adams Avenue: Holiday on Adams Avenue was held on December 12th, 2021. This free holiday gathering featured 12 tons of snow which drew hundreds of neighborhood children and their parents. Everyone enjoyed hot chocolate and peppermint ice cream provided by Ponce's Mexican Restaurant and Moosie's Ice Cream. The 2022 Holiday on Adams Avenue will be held on December 11th.
